Report Cards

Student report cards will be sent home the week of June 1st. Due to the school buildings being closed and the district following the Hold Harmless approach during Distance Learning, grades as of March 12th will be the marking point for report cards. Due to distance learning, there may not have been enough time for students to demonstrate their knowledge of some grade level standards- in this instance, these will be left blank, and students will revisit these standards next school year. Keep in mind, a student's third trimester grade will not be lower than the previous trimester.

Summer Learning Challenge

Our goal as teachers is to encourage the learning to continue! To participate in the back-to-school reading and math challenge event, you must complete BOTH the math and reading challenge.
